Focus of the week: Maths facts

Maths lessons at Crosslee are fun and focus on a 'can do' attitude by building skills and confidence at the same time. All of these lessons build on basic number facts. Please read on to find out more.

Maths facts

EYFS

Counting songs are frequently heard in our nursery and reception classes. Favourite songs help us to order numbers getting smaller or bigger. We also spend lots and lots of time learning about the different ways to make numbers. For example 5 is 5 fingers, 5 bears or 5 bikes. It's also 2 and 3 together, or 4 and 1 together.

KS1

As children get older they spend time learning all the ways to make each number all the way to 20. This helps to really develop their understanding of addition and subtraction as well as helping them to spot patterns relating to bigger numbers. eg 2 and 8 makes 10; 12 and 8 makes 20.
