3. Follow instructions the first time and complete the learning tasks your teacher is asking you to do.

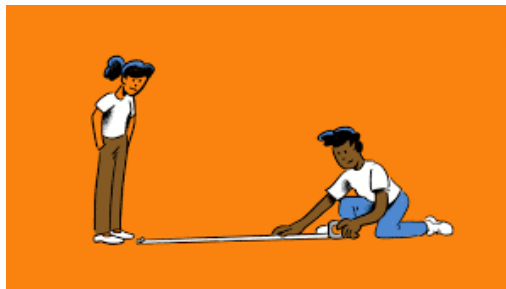


4. Come back into class from play time and lunch time sensibly and quietly so you don't disturb other learners.

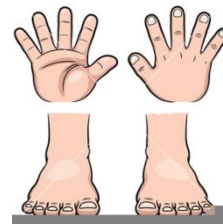

1. Be polite and use manners like 'please' and 'thank you'.



2. Keep hands, feet, objects and unkind words to ourselves.



3. Show respect to adults in our school by listening, using a calm voice and following instructions the first time.



4. Respect people's right to tell you to stop, if you're doing something that is upsetting them.



5. Respect school property; use only your allocated resources and keep them safe.

6. Respect people's personal space. Ask people permission before going into their personal space.

7. Respect the rules of games and follows the rules when playing.

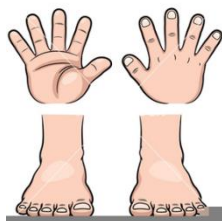
## SAFE

1. Walk around the school sensibly.

2. Be sensible as silly behaviour can lead to accidents.



3. Keep hands, feet, objects and unkind words to ourselves.



4. Tell children to stop and walk away from unsafe behaviour and go and tell an adult.



5. Do not move around school without permission.



### **What happens if we behave appropriately?**

We get rewards like:

- Verbal praise
- Dojo points
- Celebration assembly certificates
- Values certificate
- Good to be green time.
- Half termly Good to be green reward
- Our teachers share the good things we do with our parents/carers.

### **What happens if we don't behave appropriately?**

- Verbal warning
- Yellow/red card
- Lunchtime detention and reflection time
- Sent to a member of the Senior Leadership Team
- Teacher speaks to our parent/carer
- Time away from class
- Suspension
- Exclusion

School council would like everyone to try really hard with their behaviour and learn from any mistakes they might make.

### **Is our behaviour system for everyone?**

We expect everyone in our school to follow the Crosslee values and to set a good example. Some children find it hard to follow rules. We help these children in different ways so that they can feel safe and happy too.
